National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN)



Crimes are solved by law enforcement following up on intelligence information from ballistic imaging technology. Since the 1990s, ATF has worked with our law enforcement partners to place the capabilities of the NIBIN Network where it can help incarcerate armed violent offenders plaguing our communities. Today ATF has the capability to share ballistics intelligence across the United States making law enforcement resources more effective.

NIBIN Program - How it Works?

The NIBIN Program automates ballistics evaluations and provides actionable investigative leads in a timely manner. NIBIN is the only interstate automated ballistic imaging network in operation in the United States and is available to most major population centers in the United States.

Prior to the NIBIN Program, firearms examiners performed this process manually which was extremely labor intensive. To use NIBIN, firearms examiners or technicians enter cartridge casing evidence into the Integrated Ballistic Identification System. These images are correlated against the database. Law enforcement can search against evidence from their jurisdiction, neighboring ones, and others across the country. This program is one investigative tool accessed by law enforcement that allows each of us to share information and cooperation easily making all of us more effective in closing cases.

What is eTrace?

eTrace is a web-based application provided by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (BATFE) that tracks the purchase and/or use history of firearms used in violent crimes. Firearms tracing through eTrace provides for the systematic tracking of a recovered firearm from the original manufacturer or importer, through the subsequent distribution chain (wholesaler/retailer) in order to identify the first unlicensed purchaser.

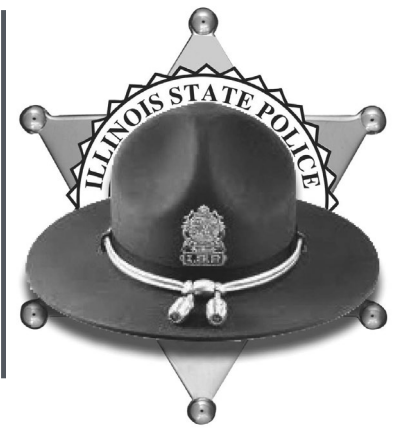
Firearms Restraining Orders (FRO) Extreme Risk Protection Orders (ERPO)



- LEADS - Firearms Restraining Order File (FRO)
 - 430 ILCS 67/ eff. 1-1-19, LEADS 3.0 provides separate formats for ex-parte Emergency and 6 month Plenary FRO entry, maintenance, removal.
 - All fields, values, message keys, caution indicators are represented in dropdown lists.
 - Entry screens reflect the actual format of the judicial court orders: Emergency (14-21 days), Plenary (6 months).
 - LEADS 3.0 can also accommodate judicial extension orders and termination orders.
 - For complete guidance see the *LEADS Reference Manual, Protective Order Chapter*, or contact ISP Help Desk.
- NCIC - Extreme Risk Protection Order File (ERPO) – Anticipated Fall 2022
 - Contains orders issued by a criminal or civil court for temporarily restricting an individual from purchasing or possessing a firearm, ammunition, or other related items, based on a finding that they may pose a significant danger of personal injury to themselves or others.
 - Qualifying LEADS FROs will be sent to NCIC ERPO File, and thus be available to LE nationwide.
 - ISP will publish the NCIC ERPO Reference Manual when the ERPO File goes live.



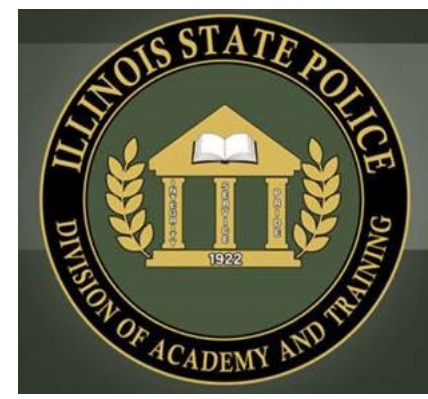
Rapid Deployment ISP Districts



- ISP welcomes opportunities to extend rapid deployment training missions with partner law enforcement agencies.
- Agency leaders looking to integrate with ISP for rapid deployment training should reach out to their local District Commander.
- Training dates will be established which will allow integrated training which will ultimately strengthen law enforcement response to critical incidents such as an active shooter.



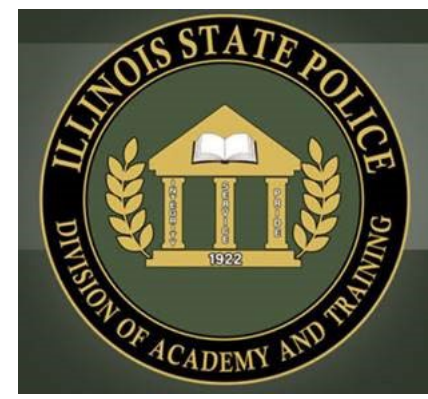
Rapid Deployment Train the Trainer



- ISP will be hosting six 24 hour Rapid Deployment Train the Trainer courses. Two per ISP Region (North, Central, South), beginning in mid July.
- The course will focus on Rapid Deployment, Active Shooter, Active Threat Assessment in both a hands on and classroom environment. It will focus on scenario based training as well as a teach back portion for certification.
- Training dates, locations and a sign up sheet will be posted to the Illinois State Police Website.



MILO Simulator Training



- MILO is a simulator based training platform that allows students to participate in high stress, rapid deployment, active shooter, shoot no-shoot scenario based training
- The ISP has four MILO Simulators strategically placed throughout the state, Des Plaines, Pesotum, Springfield and Belleville.
- ISP will be offering MILO training at each location on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday each month, starting at the end of June and running through October.
- Training dates, locations and a sign up sheet will be posted to the Illinois State Police Website.
