

INTERMEDIATE INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM FOR EXPANDING INCIDENTS

DHS/FEMA-funded course



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The Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents provides training on and resources for personnel who require advanced application of the Incident Command System (ICS). The course expands upon information covered in Introduction to Incident Command System (IS-100.b) and ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents (IS-200.b). At the conclusion of the course, participants will be able to describe how the NIMS Command and Management component supports the management of expanding incidents and incident/event management process for supervisors as prescribed by the ICS. Students will also gain the knowledge to implement the incident management process on a expanding incident and develop an Incident action plan.

Topics

- Given a simulated situation, identify roles and reporting relationships under a Unified Command that involves agencies within the same jurisdiction and under multijurisdictional conditions.
- Develop incident objectives for a simulated incident.
- Create an ICS Form 215, Operational Planning Worksheet, and an ICS Form 215A, Incident Action Plan Safety Analysis, using a given scenario.
- Create a written IAP for an incident/event using the appropriate ICS forms and supporting materials and use the IAP to conduct an operational period briefing.
- Explain the principles and practices of incident resources management.
- Identify demobilization considerations for a given scenario.

- IS-700.a: National Incident Management System (NIMS), An Introduction
- IS-800.b: National Response Framework (NRF), An Introduction
