
On November 11, 2014, the Lincolnshire Police Department conducted a multi-agency "Active Shooter/Rapid Deployment" training exercise at Stevenson High School. The purpose of the exercise was to prepare first level responding police and fire personnel for a unified response to an active shooter/mass casualty incident through reality based scenario training.

Forty-seven (47) law enforcement officers from nine law enforcement agencies and 45 firefighter/paramedics from eight fire departments participated in the training exercise. The exercise proved to be extremely beneficial for the first responders, providing them the opportunity to enhance their tactics in response to an active shooter incident as well as to work with other agencies as they would in a real world situation.

In order to successfully complete this training exercise, the Lincolnshire Police Department called upon the assistance of law enforcement personnel skilled in the tactics of such situations. In addition, extra personnel were needed to ensure the safety of everyone involved prior to and throughout the exercise, to evaluate the performance of the first responders, and to control the role players as well as the direction of the exercise. These tasks could not have been accomplished if not for the invaluable assistance of Randy Olsberg. Mr. Olsberg was instrumental coordinating the exercise, providing detailed insight into the performance of the supervisors, assisting with safety, and controlling the direction of the exercise. Concluding the exercise, Mr. Olsberg submitted a detailed After Action Report outlining the performance of the exercise and those supervisors in which he evaluated.

Please pass along my sincerest appreciation to Randy Olsberg for his commitment, dedication and exceptional performance in making the training exercise beneficial for all the first responders who participated.
