2005 ILEAS Local Law Enforcement Agency Grants

Out of \$6,975,000 in local grants issued, 195 agencies have spent \$6,168,127. (*Note – The bottom line has changed on the ILEAS local grants because we have added six state university police departments to the local grant program with the addition of a "fund scrape" support from ITTF of \$200,000.) There are eight agencies with grants still outstanding.

Dues/Conference Fees

ILEAS has sent several team members to the law enforcement HAZMAT Operations class at Anniston, Alabama. They had previously attended the IFSI HAZMAT Operations class. Their mission is to compare the fire-related HAZMAT class at IFSI to the law enforcement related HAZMAT training at Anniston. Their report is pending and we will have a recommendation next month. Note that there is resistance to this from IFSI and the ITTF Training committee.

Training Scheduled:

- Two Tactical Commanders Courses are scheduled for this fall.
- · Night vision is scheduled in October.
- Another basic SWAT class is scheduled for April 2007.
- Mobile Field Force Basic and Mobile Force Commander are being scheduled for later in the fall.

Basic SWAT

DHS Grants and Training have denied our Basic SWAT course certification. However, they provided a list of specific things that need to be fixed in order to attain certification. NIPAS has been given the list and is working on making the required changes.

11th Team

Apparently, the proposed 11th SRT team slated for the Southern Cook County area will not be formed this year. With board approval and an identified budget, they can form a team in the future.

Mobile Field Force

A meeting is scheduled for August 29th with the NIPAS board to discuss the possibility of the NIPAS Mobile Field Force to become an ILEAS Mobile Field Force. St. Clair County Sheriff Merle Justus has sent a letter to the ILEAS office asking to form a Mobile Field Force in St. Clair County. He has offered to be the lead agency. A meeting is being scheduled for Jim Luecking to explain the program to interested Chiefs in that area. Some interest has been received from the Kankakee/Will County area for a Mobile Field Force but we are waiting for this to develop.

The first MCATI Protestor Device Course was held in Rantoul July 1-13. Five members from Chicago PD also attended. An MCATI Command course is being scheduled sometime this fall. The first draft of the ILEAS Mobile Field Force training manual has been completed.

Preliminary talks have been held with LDV for the design of a mobile field force vehicle.

FY 2006 Budget

The majority of the Director's time in July has been spent on budget development. The budget has been submitted to the ITTF for the development of grant agreements. Once those are developed and signed, ILEAS can start expending the funds.

As you know, on June 27th, the ILEAS Governing Board passed a recommended \$15.06 million budget to the ITTF. At the June 28th ITTF meeting, that amount was adjusted upwards to \$18.174 million. On July 17th, ILEAS was contacted by Dr. Harvey Drucker, chair of the ITTF Science and Technology Committee. He asked that ILEAS partner with his committee to purchase and distribute \$3 million in radiation detectors. An agreement is forthcoming between ILEAS and ITTF with regard to those funds. If that passes, the bottom line ILEAS budget for FFY 2006 is \$21.174 million. For more details, see the attached grant budget report.

New Positions

Please note in the budget document that there are six new contractor positions that have been proposed. They are:

<u>Inventory Manager</u> – This year, the rule changed with regard to the required inventory requirements. Last year we only had to inventory about 30 items. This year, we have to inventory a couple of thousand items. The inventory process will require that we determine, by serial number, all of the items we distributed over \$5,000 (and in some cases possibly over \$2,000). That includes 500 VHF radios, 600+ MDC's, 600+ StarCom21 radios, mobile command posts, WMD SRT team equipment, target hardening equipment, etc. etc. We have discussed this position with Jennifer Ford – who is finishing her Master's Degree in Public Administration and was recently an intern with ILEAS.

<u>Field Inventory Inspectors</u> – Our plan is to have each chief and sheriff who received property from us complete an inventory sheet online. However, there will be a large percentage that will not complete the online form. For those agencies, ILEAS will have to visit them to inspect the equipment. The plan is to hire one part-time, temporary person per region (more in regions 3 and 4) to go out and inspect the property.

<u>Technology Programs Manager</u> - Given our experience with the credentialing project, we feel that it is necessary to contract with someone to manage both the credentialing and the ILCEAR projects to ensure our fiscal due diligence with regard to contracting for consultants, purchasing millions of dollars of computer

equipment, etc. The person that we are considering has been an Assistant State's Attorney for many years and is making a career change from lawyer to information technology. We also plan to use him to help manage all the contracts, memorandums of understanding and agreements that ILEAS has.

<u>SEOC Liaison Team</u> - This has previously been discussed by both the Governing Board and the Executive Committee. IEMA has requested that whenever the State EOC is activated, that ILEAS staff a position in the SEOC to represent local law enforcement. The first time we tried this was during the FLUEX exercise in May. After our experience there, it appears that the best way to develop this team is to select 4 or 5 experienced command level officers who would make up the team. More to follow on this as it occurs.

<u>ILEAS Workshop Presenters</u> - The ILEAS staff is developing a series of regional workshops throughout the state to present to law enforcement executive and command staff a review of all ILEAS projects, policies, web site resource/alarm card issues, etc. this series of workshops will be conducted in partnership with the regional training teams and IESMA. We propose to hire fouor trainers who would work with the mobile teams to set up these regional workshops and to actually conduct them as they occur.

<u>Mobile Field Force Trainers</u> – The model for mobile field force training is a multi-pronged approach. As teams are stood up, they send supervisors to the 40 hour MCATI train-the-trainer sessions in Rantoul, Illinois. They return to their regions and set up the first mobile field force 24-hour training session. ILEAS will send two fully trained and experienced mobile field force instructors to oversee and to assist the local trainers. We plan to have four of these trainers that will be able to travel the state, coordinate and conduct training. Additionally, they will do follow up visits to the teams to ensure that they are in compliance with standards and policies.

FY 2005 Remaining Funds

ILEAS must spend these funds by December 31, 2006. See the attached budget report for the status of FY 2005 funds.

State Funds

The State of Illinois has provided in FY 2006 (in IEMA's budget) for ILEAS for purchases NOT allowable uder Federal Guidelines. See the attached budget report for details.

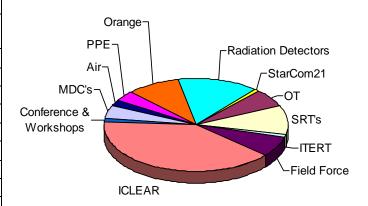
FFY 2006 Grant Budget Detail Proposal

July 27, 2006

Background – Basic Federal Grant Budget for FFY 2006

On June 27, 2006 the ILEAS Governing Board adopted a resolution recommending a specific \$15,060,000 budget to the Illinois Terrorism Task Force. This budget was based on the Federal Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP) Federal award of \$14,560,000 local law enforcement grants plus an additional \$500,000 assigned to ILEAS from the Illinois State Police. On June 28th, the Illinois Terrorism Task Force (ITTF) accepted the ILEAS budget proposal and ADDED an additional \$3,114,000. During the week of July 17th, ILEAS was contacted by Dr. Harvey Drucker, the Chair of the ITTF Science and Technology Committee. He requested that ILEAS administer the \$3,000,000 in local funds budgeted by ITTF for radiation detectors. This is a conditional offer and the final decision has not been made. ILEAS has a firm grand total budget of \$18,174,000. If the Science and Technology funds are assigned to ILEAS, the final budget will be \$21,174,000. The final ILEAS grant budget is shown in the table below:

FFY 2006 ILEAS LETPP Fund Distribution

The ILEAS Governing Board made a budget recommendation and the ITTF adopted the adjusted version. The ILEAS and ITTF staff worked together and made some final adjustments to the numbers. We would ask that the Governing Board review the final budget for consideration at the July 27th meeting.

STEP 1 - Fund Classifications

The ITTF requires that all of the standing committees (of which ILEAS is one) submit a detailed expenditure budget. The first step in this process is to break down each line item project into five fund "classification" activities – Organization, Planning, Training, Equipment and Management & Administration (M&A). This is an important step in that grant conditions for each of those purposes have differing restrictions on how the funds can be spent. The table below is the staff's recommendation of the breakdown by fund classifications:

STEP 2 - Grant Agreements

The next step is to combine like projects into "grant agreements." These are agreements that IEMA produces which identifies the grant amount, purpose and spending conditions. Traditionally, the ILEAS President or the Executive Director signs the grant agreements with IEMA. Once grant agreements are signed, ILEAS then has the spending authority to expend funds. The table below is the staff's recommendation to IEMA for grant development.

<u>STEP 3 - Specific Grant Agreement Spending Plans</u>
The next step required by ITTF is to provide a detailed expenditure plan for each of these grant agreements. The following is the staff recommendation for the disbursement of each fund for FFY 2006. Note that these funds must be expended by December 31, 2007. The specific grant agreements are also known in budgetary terms as "projects".
