Website

The ILEAS website has had 187,000 hits since it started in January of 2005. It consists of over 100 individual pages and links. Updates are now being made regularly to all the pages.

Dues

70 agencies (9%) have yet to pay \$3,295 in dues. ILEAS staff is starting to call the chiefs and sheriffs directly of all of these agencies. With board approval, they will be ineligible for grants, reimbursements, etc.

We have posted all of the Governing Board agendas & minutes and Executive Director Reports that we presently have copies. The new Consortium agendas & minutes are on the public page and the Corporation agendas & minutes are behind the password.

New Contract Staff

There has been one change to the contract staff since the last meeting. The Administrative Aide, Joyce Humes, left ILEAS after one month to accept a position with the University of Illinois. She has been replaced by Michele Watson. Michele spent over 11 years with the local East Central Illinois Police Training Project, the local Region 12 MTU. Michele brings a lot of experience in the police training world to ILEAS and we are looking forward to working with her. Her responsibilities will include supporting the training that ILEAS will be doing, mobile field force, regional workshops, etc.

Organizational Status

- The first Mobile Field Force team commanders meeting was held October 19 at the ILEAS office. It
 was an opportunity for the commanders from across the state to meet their peers and discus items of
 mutual concern.
- Jim Luecking has a meeting with the Kankakee County Police Chiefs on November 15 to discuss the formation of a Mobile Field Force in that area.
- The SOG's are ready to be approved by the board.

Training

- MCATI Basic and Protestor Device classes have been held at Rantoul. Members from all regional teams have attended.
- Team members of some of the teams have attended the MCATI Command course in Anniston.
- We are working to schedule all three courses in Illinois in the spring.
- An ILEAS training cadre has been developed, the manual for the 3 day basic is being printed and we will be scheduling the basic courses in the spring.

WMD Special Response Teams

Equipment

- Nine Bearcats have been ordered. Jim Luecking, Ed Mohn and Ed Roncone will be going to the Lenco factory in Pittsfield, MA on November 29 to inspect the first Bearcat.
- Each team has received a radiation detector.
- Atropine Injectors have been delivered.
- 2 Personal Dosimeters per team will be delivered at the training session.
- All teams except Region 9/11 have received their basic equipment. Most of the purchases are now involving replacement and/or new team members.
- Assembling the information needed to order the Decon systems for the teams.

New Purchasing System

After much work, the new online purchasing system is now being used. After experience with the original system and having undergone our first audit, the new purchasing system is designed with the annual audit in mind. Highlights of the system are:

- All purchases must be tied to a funding source and all vendors must have a justification entered.
- The system still requires ITTF staff to approve grant funded expenditures and now the ILEAS President must approve non-grant expenditures.
- A balance of obligated and non-obligated balances will be maintained for each funding source to prevent overspending in any line item.
- It ties the Purchase Orders, to the vendor invoice number, to the line item in the Treasurer's QuickBooks and to the IEMA Comptroller grant number.

We will keep the old system and the new system running simultaneously until all the current purchases are closed. They will then be converted to the new system.

Audio and Video Teleconferencing

In order to expend Federal funds on audio- or video-teleconferencing equipment and accounts, ILEAS must adopt a Comprehensive Communications Plan (see below). Once adopted, ILEAS can purchase the appropriate equipment. In the meantime, ILEAS has established an account for audio-conferencing through the Illinois Central Management Services. If any committee chair needs audio-teleconference capability for an ILEAS-related meeting, please contact the ILEAS Administrative Office for the number and pass codes.

Once the Communications Plan has been adopted, ILEAS can implement a video-conferencing capability at the main office. A state-bid quote for the equipment and installation is ready to go. This video-conferencing capability can be utilized by ILEAS staff, Board members or other officials in east central Illinois for ILEAS or homeland security-related meetings.

Inventory

ILEAS has started the inventory audit process. The Inventory Policy (see below) is being presented to the Board for approval. Once adopted, we can start the implementation of the inventory audit. This will be a self-certification audit where each chief and sheriff can go online and certify that they still have the specific equipment that we believe they have. We are going to hire 10-12 field inspectors to visit those agencies that do not self-certify.

We are looking for trustworthy retired police officers who could conduct those field inspections. They would be contracted on a temporary part-time basis. We need at least one per region and more in Regions 3 and 4. I am asking for the assistance of the Regional Co-Chairs to make suggestions of someone in each region that could assist us with the inventory.

Policies

Please see the proposed policies that have been distributed. All of these policies have been vetted through IEMA, ITTF and the Executive Committee. We would ask for consideration of passage for each of them.

<u>Inventory Policy</u> – An inventory audit is required each year by both the Federal and State governments. We are required to inventory everything with a value exceeding \$5,000. However, the ILEAS staff has expanded that to include all serialized communications equipment and, for one year only, respirators.

<u>Travel Policy</u> – This is an update to an old policy that reflects the new practices and contracts and is more in line with the ITTF Training Committee.

<u>Donations Policy</u> – This has been discussed at the last two meetings. Kevin Eack authored the first version and it has been approved through our attorney and the Executive Committee.

Overtime/Backfill Reimbursement Policy - Again, an update reflecting new procedures and rules.

<u>Comprehensive Communications Plan</u> – We were required to submit this in order to purchase video- and audio-teleconferencing equipment and services.

<u>Credentialing Background</u> – This document is the result of a ad hoc committee of MABAS, IESMA, ISP and ILEAS representatives. This committee was tasked to develop a policy for the issuance of secured credentials. this will be considered by the entire ITTF on October 25th.

<u>Air Support Plan</u> – Developed by Chief Tim Swanson as requested by Chairman Chamness. the ILEAS Governing Board must adopt this plan and forward it to the Task Force for their consideration.

Respirators

At the September ITTF meeting, Mike Chamness asked ILEAS to chair an ad hoc committee to deal with the Dept. of Labor issues regarding respirators, most specifically the N-95 respirators. The committee consists of ILEAS, MABAS. IESMA and Public Health representatives. More to follow as it develops.

Additionally, ILEAS has purchased 300 more AVON respirators. They are now CBRNE NIOSH approved. In November, an electronic order form will be posted online for agencies to request additional respirators.

ILEAS is in the process of ordering 125,000 N-95 masks to stockpile for regional emergencies. Additionally, ILEAS has negotiated access to the 3M online OSHA medical evaluation form at a cost to local agencies of \$23 per officer AND 20 days of train the trainer training for fit testing and use of the N-95.

Radiation Detector

The RFP for the radiation detectors will close on November 1, 2006. There has been a lot of interest nation-wide in this RFP and several vendors will be submitting proposals. a committee will be established including Argonne National Labs, IEMA Nuclear Safety staff and ILEAS to review the proposals.

- Jim Page will be attending the Grants and Training Conference in Washington, D.C. November 27-30.
- Jim Luecking, Ed Mohn and Ed Roncone (NIPAS Commanders) will be traveling to Massachusetts on November 29 to inspect the first Bearcat completed and ready for delivery.
- Jennifer Ford will start annual inventory visits to all ten of the WMD SRT Teams in December.
- Michele Watson will be attending the New Madrid Earthquake threat conference in St. Louis November 2-3.

ILEAS has budgeted funds to purchase approximately 100 MDC's for local grants. The Grant Committee will meet and establish standards for how those MDC's will be distributed. We will hopefully make an public announcement in November about the opening of the grant process.

Additionally, ITTF Chairman Chamness has asked ILEAS and MABAS to spend \$184,000 that was made available to IEMA pursuant to the 9-11 License Plate Fund. ILEAS and MABAS agreed to conduct a grant process to distribute thermal imagers. If approved by ITTF at the meeting on October 25th, then ILEAS will conduct the grant process for the imagers. The grant announcement has been delayed until that authorization occurs so that we could announce both the imagers and the MDC's at the same time and open the grant process up only once.
