## **Line of Credit Expansion**

Please refer to the Minutes and Issues Document from the July 2020 Board meeting for background information on a proposed expanded line of credit from \$250,000 to \$700,000 so that the two Bearcats can be paid for anticipated delayed reimbursements from the State. Subject: PNC Line of Credit

#### Greetings:

With regard to the PNC Bank Line of Credit increase, it looks like it is not going to happen. As you know, we accepted the bank's terms but had a couple of changes that we needed based on Mick and Jan's recommendations. The bank rejected those changes. Additionally, they stated that if we insisted on those changes they would have to send it back to their attorneys and would require that ILEAS would have to pay for its lawyers to do that. I called a full stop on that.

In the meantime, we have worked with LENCO and they are going to issue us a net 30-day invoice. As soon as we get the invoice in hand, it goes to IEMA. Jan and Larry have worked with IEMA finance folks and they are going to hand walk it thru the system. In fact, they have already locked in the money waiting for the invoice. We do have the \$250K line of credit still and if necessary, we can give LENCO a \$250K down payment. They are aware of the situation and will work with us. The Bearcats are being delivered on Sunday. We have the invoice and will submit it Monday morning.

I am optimistic that this will work. A lot of work by several, staff went into this, but we decided that we were not going to pay thousands in legal fees for a bank's attorneys. We have run a hundred million dollars thru PNC and were pretty disappointed that they would not reasonably work with us.

As a result, we will NOT need a special Board meeting. Sorry for all the emails and calls. I will let you know what happens.

**Subject:** Bearcat Money

Director Tate-Nadeau,

As you know, given MABAS and ILEAS' unique nature, we sometimes have challenges getting reimbursements in a timely manner – especially this time of year. We have met and worked with your grant and financial staff and your Chief of Staff over the last several months to overcome those challenges. Given that, *I want to take this opportunity to congratulate your staff for the swift processing of \$685,512 for two Bearcat Rescue Vehicles.* We submitted the invoice on August 24<sup>th</sup>. The money will be in our account tomorrow. That is only 13 business days! Normally an invoice may take up to two months to process. We worked with the vendor and got a 30 day net invoice and your staff was able to make it happen. Their effort was outstanding! They worked with us every step of the way. Our backup plan was a \$700,000 line of credit from the bank which would have caused us to pay a lot in interest.

I want to specifically thank Declan Binninger, Jane Hewitt, Bob Evans and Sami Ahmed. I am sure there are others along the way who helped this along, of which I am unaware, that I want to thank as well. The IEMA staff have always been helpful and we sincerely appreciate it. Sometimes I feel like we are always bringing up money issues so I wanted to let you know of the successes and not just the problems. Along with the entire ILEAS staff, I want to express my sincere thanks and appreciation for getting this done for us. Please let everyone involved know how appreciative we are of their efforts.

At the end of the day, the two Bearcats were delivered and paid for within the 30-day net requirement. ILEAS withdrew its request for the expanded line of credit.

## **Bearcat Purchase and Status Update**

#### **To-Date Summary of Bearcat Capital Replacement**

At the March 26, 2020 Board meeting, the Board discussed at length the specifics of replacing the 14 year old Bearcats as part of a capital replacement strategy. The Board approved the inter-fund movement of money to order two new Bearcats. Because of the ongoing COVID19 restrictions, more funds became available and the Board approved the acquisition of a third Bearcat. All three Bearcats have been ordered with a delivery dates in August 2020 for the first two and May 2021 for the third one. As a part of the State FY21 PAR grant, ILEAS was approved to acquire a 4<sup>th</sup> Bearcat at a cost of \$325,000. Discussion with the vendor resulted in an agreement that if ordered by the end of July, the Bearcat would be complete in June of 2021. These PAR funds close on June 30, 2021.

#### **NIPAS Bear**

Last month the Board discussed the arrangement with the NIPAS Special Response Team with regard to their current Bear (larger version of a Bearcat). Their new Bearcat will replace their full-sized Bear. ILEAS has \$189,000 remaining in the budget in 18UAILESRT. NIPAS leadership and ILEAS have agreed to an arrangement for those funds and the Bear. ILEAS has issued purchase orders for equipment for the NIPAS Special Response Team. In consideration of that, NIPAS will cede their Bear to ILEAS for redistribution. ILEAS has since issued the purchase orders for that equipment which includes accessory equipment for their new Bearcat such as a forced entry ram, back up camera/monitor, roof mounted remote control spotlight, run flat tires, etc. It is estimated that he NIPAS Bearcat will arrive in January 2021 and the transfer of the Bear to ILEAS will take place shortly thereafter.

#### **Replacement Strategy**

The first two Bearcats have arrived and have been distributed to Region 9/11 and Region 6/7 WMD Special Response Teams. Region 9/11 will retain their current Bearcat. The 9/11 area is so large, that the mileage on their current Bear is getting high. Adding a shared Bearcat to the three Regions will lessen that mileage build up which will lengthen its useful life. The original Region 6/7 Bearcat, however, will be surplused. In January of 2021 (estimate), the Bear from NIPAS and the surplus Bearcat from 6/7 will be available to be reassigned. In June, two more Bearcats (the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> orders) will also be available. The plan (agreed to by NIPAS) at this point, is to:

- announce the availability of the Bear and the Bearcat
- open up an online application process
- assemble a committee of staff and Board members to review and make selections of where those available vehicles will go
- The application process is being developed at this time.

Once the awards are made, the armor will be transferred to the new owners. Once the transfers are done, this will be the status of Special Response Team armor:

- Region North will have one (new) in DuPage County and one (current) in Will County.
- Region 6/7 will have one (new) in Peoria County and one (current) in Rock Island County.
- Region 8 will have one current Bearcat. However, Region 8 also has STARRS funded armor in the area as well.
- Region 6 will have one current Bearcat.
- Region 9/11 will have one new and one current available.

## **Special Teams Equipment Acquisition Update**

The following equipment has been ordered from State FY21 PAR:

- Ninety-four of the LION MT94 protective suits for the WMD SRT Teams for \$200,972
- Carbon fiber replacement bottles (beginning of 3 year project) for \$145,756
- Three Ford F350's which completes the Mobile Field Force teams' vehicle replacement project at a total of \$136,461
- \$50,000 of HAVEN Gear for the Mobile Field Force teams that will outfit NIPAS MFF team completely, with approximately 20 extras for new ILEAS MFF Members.

From Federal grants, ILEAS has also acquired 700 sets of laser-resistant eyewear for special teams' members. This purchase was based on the increasing prevalence of rioters aiming commercial grade lasers at officers' eyes.

## IEMA, National Guard, ISP and ILEAS Project

As everyone is aware, during the recent COVID19 and the civil unrest, the State Police, ILEAS and National Guard created the Joint Operations Command and the Regional Law Enforcement Support Centers. Please see the Issues Document from the July 23, 2020 meeting regarding the JOC and the LESCs. The creation and operation of the JOC and the LESCs worked very well with regard to efficiency of messaging, information distribution, coordinating resource requests across all LE agencies, etc. The relationships built at the JOC/LESC levels were, and are, invaluable. However, there was concern expressed by the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) and IEMA about being kept in the dark about ongoing issues.

To that end, the National Guard, IEMA, ILEAS and ISP have been engaged in weekly phone conferences (seven) about the issue and how to proceed the next time a statewide emergency occurs. The discussion has resulted in a draft State Emergency Operations Plan Annex for widespread criminal activity which outlines the responsibilities, obligations and authorities for the various LE players. There will be a table top exercise for Gubernatorial Cabinet level agency leaders regarding this plan and how it would apply during the upcoming election.

More to follow on this. At the next meeting, we anticipate that the new Annex will be approved and presented to the Board to review.

NOTE – Operational planning for the upcoming election is in progress. The Board will not meet until after the election. If any Board member has operational questions, please call Jim Page. All team commanders will be apprised as soon as possible as to the potential role that teams may play.

## **NARCAN Update**

ILEAS is still actively distributing NARCAN at no cost to law enforcement across Illinois. NARCAN distribution by the numbers:

- 6,219 two-pack boxes have been distributed (12,438 doses)
- 164 law enforcement agencies are participating (23 more are in the process of registering/training)
- 22 fire agencies have received NARCAN from ILEAS
- 2,265 officers/deputies have been trained in NARCAN use (an additional 49 are in training and 679 are in the registration process)
