Governing Board Meeting September 27, 2018

Sergeant at Arms Appointment

The resignation of Saline County Sheriff Keith Brown on August 28, 2018 created a vacancy as Both Region 11 Co-chair and as the Board Sergeant at Arms. The ILEAS By-Laws Section 3.18 allows the President to appoint – with the advice and consent of the Board - a qualifying Board member to fill Officer vacancies until the next election. President Snyders is appointing Region 9 Co-Chair Sean Reynolds to be the Board Sergeant at Arms.

Requested Board Action

President Dave Snyders requests that the Board consider the appointment of Chief Reynolds as the Sergeant at Arms of ILEAS.

New Region 11 Co-Chair

The above-mentioned resignation of Sheriff Brown also created a vacancy in Region 11. The ILEAS By-Laws Section 3.5 provides that the remaining Regional Co-Chair can appoint a replacement for the vacancy. Chief Harry Masse has appointed Jackson County Sheriff Robert Burns to replace Sheriff Brown.

Requested Board Action

No Board action is necessary at this time. Welcome Sheriff Burns to the Board.

Incident Management Team (IMT)

The Board should take note that this year ILEAS did not get the IMT grant. ILEAS has been the fiduciary for that grant for several years. The grant was usually for approximately \$25,000. In FY18, ITTF and IEMA decided to move the IMT grant to Logan County. Logan County also administers the Emergency Management Assistance TEAM (IEMAT) and other emergency management grants. ITTF wanted to consolidate all EM grants into one entity. It represents a loss of around \$1,200 in M&A funds. However, this transfer lessens the administrative burden on the finance staff.

Requested Board Action

Staff requests that the Board adopt the final Federal Fy18 budget for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 as determined by IEMA.

Unmet Needs Budget Report

As reported at the last Board meeting, ILEAS received \$442,500 in State funds (as opposed to Federal grants) to be spent on specific capital replacement items between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019. This table shows the status of those projects.

Requested Board Action

No action required.

IDPH NARCAN Grant Update

The grant paperwork as finally been processed and ILEAS has already received 80% of the first year's budget. Staff has identified 98 potential agencies in the 18-county targeted area plus the Illinois State Police Southern Drug Task Force.

- Sixty-four of those 99 agencies have written agreements in place with ILEAS to participate (65% participation).
- RPCs Fellows, Stearns and Tanner are currently reaching out to agencies not yet signed up. So far, only two agencies have indicated they are not interested.

- To date, there are 677 officers/deputies on the roster for the online training and eligible to receive the NARCAN (in the July report, that number was 437).
- There are 32 more that will be entered into the system from agencies that have signed up but have not yet submitted a roster.
- Of the 18 county sheriffs, four have declined to participate (or failed to respond) Crawford, Edwards Jefferson, Lawrence
- ILEAS has shipped out 780 two-packs of NARCAN to 47 agencies that met the minimum standard for participation.
 - That standard consists of a signed ILEAS Agreement, Signed ODMAP agreement and a minimum of 40% of their officers successfully completing the training.
- ILEAS has received 792 2-packs (1,584 doses) of NARCAN for the initial distribution at a cost of \$75/2-pack.

Indilus has completed the full integration between the Topyx LMS and the ILEAS member database. Chiefs/Sheriffs in the following weeks will be able to monitor their agencies' participation, staff rosters and review status of training of their staff by using their current login credentials. Indilus has also created a complete LMS/ILEAS agency data integration that will provide necessary data to IDPH and for the local agencies as well.

Requested Board Action

No Board action is requested.

Mission Ready Packages – Special Teams

There is a database of resources and teams available for FEMA to use for national deployments maintained by the National Emergency Management Association (NEMA). There is a process for certifying each team/resource meets certain standards for deployments.

In order for ILEAS teams to be included in that database, they have to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours upon deployment. This includes:

- Communications
 - ILEAS teams already have great communications assets that can be deployed that include radios that can operate on all bands and satellite communications systems.
- Food
 - During the Operation Southern Sky eclipse exercise ILEAS successfully tested a food delivery system.
- Shelter
 - o MABAS donated to ILEAS two tent shelters complete with cots and HVAC.
- Water
 - ILEAS purchased two basic water filtration systems. MABAS donated one larger system that can process significantly more gallons per minute.

In the spring/summer of 2018, ILEAS utilized some "end of year" funds to order a customized trailer to haul everything (as identified above) necessary for Mission Capable deployments. It will be ready for pick up in October. Once acquired, the tents, water filtration systems, food preparation equipment, cots and other necessary deployment equipment will be stored in the trailer ready to go when necessary.

The first training session with Mobile Field Force teams regarding the shelter and water systems is scheduled for October 24th. Eventually, this will be added to the validation exercise for the Mobile Field Force teams.

In order to accommodate a team of 100+ members in the field, ILEAS needs to expand these capabilities as time and money allows. While this is low priority, it is a project and capability that can be built over time. The goal being that if ILEAS teams meet these stringent standards for equipment and training for national deployments, they will be more than ready for in-state missions. Another goal for this capability is to reduce our need for hotel rooms and lodging costs for in-state large exercises, deployments and training.

A written plan to expand this capability to a level that can accommodate a 100-officer deployment in the field for at least 72 hours is being developed. Once that plan is complete, it will be presented to the Board for approval so that when financial resources become available – sometimes last minute with a quick turnaround – staff can move to complete the mission capable package.

Requested Board Action

Authorize the staff to:

- 1. develop a mission capable plan for resources and teams
- 2. enter ILEAS assets/teams/resources into the mission capable database
- 3. acquire the equipment and implement the appropriate training to implement the plan

LMS Update

The LMS project is becoming very active. Besides the Coroners' Training Board, it is being used routinely for the NARCAN project. The NARCAN project was a good test for the system. Indilus wrote a complete ILEAS/Topyx interface that can be used for other LMS projects. Nearly 700 officers, deputies and corrections staff have successfully used the LMS.

ILEAS was approached by officials at the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) to discuss whether or not the ILEAS Topyx LMS could be used for safety/OSHA type training by their personnel. Over the last few months of discussions and a working group, an agreement was developed between ILEAS and IDOT to host their on-line training courses on our LMS. IDOT has recognized a need to be able to offer standardized training state wide in a manner that accomplishes their goals while at the same time saving in personnel and travel costs. We have been working with Cheryl Neff, IDOT Occupational Safety & Health Unit Manager on this project for the last year. This MOU will initially be for \$12,000 for the first year, (\$1,000 monthly). After July 1, 2019, the cost will increase to an annual rate of \$17,000. (\$1,417 monthly). Through our existing contract with TOPYX, two representatives with IDOT have received first hand training on how to utilize the system using Manager/Instructor access. ILEAS staff will retain full administrative rights and control and initially assist with uploading the IDOT users into the proper groups. After this initial set up, ILEAS staff involvement will be to act in an assist/advisory role.

Additionally, ILEAS staff have been in discussions with officials from IEMA and from the Illinois Department of Innovation and Technology (DOIT) regarding cybersecurity online training. Working with the Illinois Board of Elections and the STIC, DOIT is developing curriculum for cybersecurity for county clerks regarding election security. At this point, the State has no means to distribute the training to local counties. Additionally, DOIT is

developing a new curriculum for basic cybersecurity that can be targeted for law enforcement and other public safety personnel. Discussions are underway for DOIT to request to utilize the ILEAS LMS system to distribute this training. More to follow on that at later meetings.

Between the \$48,600 from the Coroners and \$12,000 from IDOT, ILEAS is offsetting \$60,600 of its LMS license and staff (Jessica Schulter & Bill DeJarnette). AS these projects come online, we anticipate more users that will come forward to use the system.

Requested Board Action

Staff requests the Board approve the proposed MOU with the Illinois Department of Transportation for use of the Topyx LMS system.

MOUs and Non-Member Affiliate Agreement Notification

Non-Member Affiliate

As per the ILEAS by-laws Section 2.3, the Executive Director shall notify the Board of a signed Non-Member Affiliate agency. The Eureka College Police signed the Non-Member Affiliate agreement on September 6, 2018.

IFSI/ISP Memorandums of Understanding (MOU)

The Federal grant guidance requires that 80% of the grant funds be spent by local jurisdictions. In order to balance the various programs and needs, some of those grant funds are spent at STIC and IFSI to provide the training and intelligence services that are offered to locals. Each year, ILEAS enters into agreements with both ISP and IFSI authorizing them (state agencies) to spend grant funds to provide a service and a benefit (intelligence and training) to local law enforcement agencies. A large part of STIC requests for information comes from local law enforcement. IFSI provides NIMS training to local law enforcement.

Requested Board Action

Staff requests that the Board authorize the Executive Director to enter into agreements with both the Illinois State Police and the Illinois Fire Service Institute once those agreements have been crafted and agreed to between all parties involved.

Trailer Disposition Update

At the July meeting, the Board authorized staff to dispose of three trailers. All three have been relinquished:

- The 2006 Keystone was permanently signed over to the Champaign Police Department.
- Ownership of 2006 JAYCO in Region 8 was transferred to the Monroe County Sheriff's Office.
- The 2006 Samson trailer was sold for \$850 and the funds placed into the ILEAS Business Account.

Requested Board Action

No Board action is requested.

ILEAS Foundation Update

Operation Underground Railroad (OUR) is a non-profit organization that works to counter human trafficking and online predators of children. The Attorney General's Office in Illinois oversees the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force. OUR officials approached ICAC a few months ago and offered to donate funds for them to use in the fight against online predators. Since ICAC is under the Attorney General, they were unable to accept the funds. However, the ICAC leadership put them in touch with the ILEAS Foundation. After several discussions, OUR has donated \$100,000 to the ILEAS Foundation for technology to support the ICAC Task Force operations. The table below shows how those funds have been invested:
