FY27 State Police Revocation Grant

Eligibility

Must be a member of the Violent Crime Intelligence Task Force (VCITF)

Must be a Law Enforcement Agency within the State of Illinois

Funding

The amount awarded to agencies will take into consideration the following:

- Population
- FOID/CCL Card Holders within jurisdiction
- Suspended or Revoked FOID/CCL Card Holders within jurisdiction

The State Police Revocation Grant will ONLY cover an agencies personnel costs to conduct Firearm Safety Enforcement Details

Violent Crime Intelligence Task Force

The Director of the Illinois State Police shall establish a statewide multi-jurisdictional Violent Crime Intelligence Task Force led by the Illinois State Police dedicated to combating gun violence, gun-trafficking, and other violent crime with the primary mission of preservation of life and reducing the occurrence and the fear of crime. The objectives of the Task Force shall include, but not be limited to, reducing and preventing illegal possession and use of firearms, firearm-related homicides, and other violent crimes, and solving firearm-related crimes.

GOALS

Place individuals into compliance who have had their firearm rights revoked/suspended, 430 ILCS 65/9.5

What constitutes compliance:

Individuals FOID card is surrendered, destroyed and marked destroyed in the ISP Law Enforcement (LE) Portal

OR

A lost FOID card is documented on the Firearm Disposition Record (FDR) and uploaded into the ISP LE Portal

AND

A completed FDR is then uploaded to the ISP LE Portal

Protocols

- Conduct a search in the LE Portal for those individuals not in compliance.
- Conduct a workup and de-confliction of each individual through the Statewide Terrorism Intelligence Center (STIC).
- A detail operation briefing will be conducted consistent with the detail agency standard operating procedures.
 - Detail to include phone calls and or home visits to place subjects into compliance.
- Following the detail agencies will be responsible for uploading documentation into the LE portal to place individuals into compliance.
